## **The Way Forward**

#### Veterans' Places, Pathways and People programme

The **Veterans' Places People and Pathways** programme is creating better, more sustainable support for veterans in the communities where they live. It is supporting major projects to enable veterans to access support that meets their needs.

#### **Strategic Leads**

Grants have been awarded to Cobseo, ASDIC, SSAFA and Combat Stress to act as Strategic Leads



## **The Way Forward**

#### Veterans' Places, Pathways and People programme

#### Portfolio Leads

10 Portfolio grants have been awarded, with one each in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland, with seven regional grants reflecting the Op Courage areas, awarded in England.

Across all of the portfolios 170 individual projects are being supported with funding from the Armed Forces Covenant Fund Trust.

#### **Sector Oversight Group**


The Strategic Leads are working within the wider Veterans Places, Pathways and People programme, and with the Sector Oversight Group to encourage the integration of existing clinical mental health provision with the broader non-clinical services for veterans needing general wellbeing support as well as those on the mental health recovery pathway across the sector.



### **Veteran Mental Health Awareness Standard**

- Support the VPPP programme
- Compliment the work of the Contact Group
- Non-clinical
- Safe Place for Veterans with mental health needs
- Aim –

To develop and implement a Veterans Mental Health Awareness Standard (VMHAS) that is recognised as Best Practice for the benefit of all Veterans and beneficiaries.

- Developing the content of the Self-Assessment Tool






# **Self-Assessment Tool**
